

Practice sheet - UNIT 7

In making our interactive books, one of the important elements will be finding or creating the multimedia files which will be used later in the pages of the book. In these video presentations we will first show you very basic information about music files, and then in the second film how to record voiceover and how to import background music.

We will also say a few words about creating photo and video files. We will present sources for obtaining these files from free resources on the Internet and show simple ways to record and prepare them yourself.

1. Audio files

The key to using files from the internet is to always check what licence the file is under. Are these the so-called Creative Commons or free licences? If so, what restrictions apply to the use of the file. Is it only for non-commercial use? Do we have to provide the source and author, or is the file in the so-called public domain?

Audacity

There are many programmes for recording and processing sound. Very rapid development of digital technology and the availability of fast processors and disk storage space makes sound recording increasingly easy. You do not need an elaborate home studio, the free programme Audacity is enough. It may not look up-to-date and its user interface may not be up-to-date either, but it has all the features we need. The latest version is quite simple to use.

2. Video and photo


Very good quality video and photo material can be found at:
